Economic Empowerment - Micro Financing

Eya's Angels continues to expand its impact in the community by empowering entrepreneurs through micro-financing loans.

Iya A needed funding to start an **Okrika** business and Eya's Angels offered to help secure private financing for her business.

Iya A, received needed funding plus



transportation to Douala to buy her first bail. As of today, Iya A can

be seen in Mile 4 market working to rotate her micro loan so she can take care of her family.

Mola B has a **small poultry** capable of raising about 1000 chickens. However, due to financial constraints, he currently only has 150 chickens.



Eya's Angels was able to provide a micro loan to expand his business to 400 chickens.

As of today, Mola B has 300 chicks in heating stage with 100 more scheduled to be delivered.

Iya C sent us a message for assistance with securing a **breast prosthesis** after breast surgery. In her own words she felt "pathetic". Eya's Angels was able to secure private donation of this item and Iya C was very grateful to receive it.

Iyas D & E are in process of receiving micro financing for their **burning corn** business. The goal is to expand their



nightly roasting capacity from 1 to 2 bags, possibly doubling their incomes.

This will enable them to better support their families.
